IRENE started in 2001 as a network of primary care physicians and has grown to include clinics in 76 of Iowa's 99 counties. We plan to expand our membership to include nurse practitioners, physician assistants, pharmacists, and specialists. We also plan to develop a patient stakeholder advisory board and steering committee.

A huge thank you to the clinics that participated in two large research projects during the Covid pandemic. In one study with seven PBRNs comparing two models for helping patients with advanced


care planning, IRENE was the leader in patient recruitment. The clinics in this study included:

- West Broadway Clinic, Council Bluffs
- Knoxville Hospital and Clinic
- Regional Family Health, Manchester
- UIHC clinics in Riverside, Muscatine, and Iowa City

In an NIH-funded initiative called Rapid Acceleration of Diagnostics (RADx), IRENE network clinics helped evaluate the efficacy of a device for SARS-CoV-2 diagnostic tests and collect samples for COVID-19 research. The following IRENE clinics were involved with this study:

- Genesis Family Medical Center, Davenport
- West Broadway Clinic, Council Bluffs
- Family Medicine Great River Medical Center, West Burlington
- West Fork Family Medicine, Rockwell

With the hard work of all the clinicians and staff, IRENE enrolled the highest number of patients of all the organizations in these two studies. See map below.

Upcoming Projects

The NIH's All of Us Research Program has created a national research resource that will include comprehensive de-identified health information for more than one million people in the United States. The Heartland Consortium is the first group dedicated to engaging participants in the Midwest. In particular, the Heartland Consortium aims to boost the participation of people who live in rural areas and other groups historically underrepresented in research. IRENE will play a key role in recruiting underrepresented patients into this initiative.





The goal of the All of Us Research Program is to advance precision medicine research, one day enabling clinicians to tailor patient care by accounting for individual differences in biology, behavior, and environment. Researchers will be able to use this resource to better understand the risk factors for certain diseases and inform future treatments and prevention.

Coordinated Care for Patients with Chronic Conditions
