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## What is emrU?

emrU is an Epic electronic health record software environment created for use solely by the Health Sciences here at The University of Iowa. Our goals are to enhance existing classes, facilitate interprofessional education and provide students with a solid background in how to use an electronic medical record before they graduate – an essential skill for anyone in healthcare today.

## This month: First patient, College of Pharmacy, overall project expansion

- A milestone was reached – our first curriculum-driven from-scratch patient was built in our training environment. While the final details of this patient need to be approved by the course instructor, it is a solid first step.
- This month we met with The College of Pharmacy to start to realize some of the interprofessional aspects of this exciting project. The meeting set the stage for collaboration between technical staff of this project and the clinicians & faculty of The College of Pharmacy.
- Behind-the-scenes work continues to ensure that the technical infrastructure will be in place on schedule, as well as will meet the technical demands and needs of the curriculum.

## Current status:

We are finalizing the first patient and beginning the specification & build process for the second patient for one of the first classes of the new Carver College of Medicine curriculum.

Work continues on the specification and building of patients with imaging studies for a recurring two-week hands-on course for Clinical Radiology. Additionally we are working with Radiology on a long-term project to provide a large number of imaging studies in the emrU training environment for student & resident learning and evaluation.

**emrU is slated to come online this fall**, with behind-the-scenes access to patient cases this month, testing in August, and first classroom use scheduled for September 2013.
