

RESULTS OF THE 2009 MATCH

In 2009, 143 senior medical students will graduate from the University of Iowa Carver College of Medicine. A summary of their success in obtaining a residency position for further training follows below with respect to their participation in the National Resident Matching Program (NRMP):

68 graduates (48% of the class) are entering primary care training: Family Medicine – 17 (12%), Internal Medicine – 20 (14%), Medicine-Dermatology – 1 (1%), Medicine-Pediatrics – 1 (1%), Medicine-Primary Care – 1 (1%), Obstetrics-Gynecology – 9 (6%), and Pediatrics – 19 (13%).

35 graduates (25%) will take first-year postgraduate training in Iowa. 24 graduates (17%) will take first-year post-graduate training at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics.

Geographically, the most popular states after Iowa for first-year training were: California (13), Missouri (8), and Ohio and Texas (7 each).
