<p>Applicants are encouraged to schedule a clerkship at the location they hope to do their residency</p> <p>Each service has their own dates and deadlines for their applications</p> <p>The board meets in late November to decide where applicants will go, with results released mid-December</p>	<p>Applicant registration opens early July*</p> <p>The Centralized Application Service (CAS) opens to programs mid-September*</p> <p>The OSAC Registrar Unit uploads medical school transcript and the MSPE; the student uploads all other materials</p> <p>Rank order list is due January*</p> <p>Results released Feb 6*</p> <p>Students who match in Ophthalmology may need preliminary or transitional year</p> <p>Apply through ERAS to find a PGY1 position</p> <p>Submit a separate rank order list through the NRMP</p>	<p>MyERAS opens for students in early-June</p> <p>ERAS for programs opens September 27 and they begin to download applications</p> <p>The National Resident Matching Program (NRMP) opens September 15: this is a separate registration and fee</p> <p>The Medical Student Performance Evaluation (MSPE) is released September 27</p> <p>Interview offers may begin soon after September 27 and continue throughout the fall</p> <p>Interviews may take place October through January (specialty dependent)</p> <p>The NRMP Rank order list (ROL) certification deadline is March 1</p> <p>Results are released the third Friday in March</p>
<p>Students who do not match will have time to enter the civilian match</p> <p>Submit a separate rank order list through the NRMP</p>		<p>For Urology, students apply to programs through ERAS, but submit a rank order list to the American Urological Association (AUA) match</p> <p>ROLs are due in January*</p> <p>Results are released Feb 1*</p>
