Eligibility

Eligible students must have completed their sophomore or junior year toward a bachelor's degree at an accredited four-year college in the U.S. in the biological or physical sciences by June 2018.

Applications are accepted throughout the year, with a deadline of February 1, 2018 for completed applications. Students wishing to complete the application process should submit the following items directly to the address listed in this brochure, unless otherwise indicated

2. Three letters of recommendation from faculty familiar with your skills and aptitudes (particularly in the biological sciences)

3. Transcripts of all academic work (should include Fall 2017)
